CHANTILLY, Virginia: NOVA Pets Health Center helped nearly 500 animals through their collection event, Santa Paws for a Cause, to benefit animals at the Fairfax County Animal Shelter.

The event, Santa Paws for a Cause, invited canine, feline, small mammal and exotic pet owners to receive a free photo of their pets with Santa when they brought in a donation from the list of acceptable donations for the shelter. NOVA Pets Health Center collected dog and cat beds, a variety of canine and feline toys, treats, and many cans of wet food.

“The shelter volunteers were very surprised when we showed up with our donations,” Taylor Lenox, Marketing Specialist said. “They were impressed with the amount and variety of products we were able to collect.”

According to their website, Fairfax County Animal Shelter is the only open-access, municipal shelter in the county with 4,000 to 5,000 animals coming through the facility each year and is in constant demand of a variety of items for many different breeds.

“I am very proud of us as an organization that we could help as many animals as we did,” Soubhaan Masood, NOVA Pets Operations Manager said. “I am even more proud that our surrounding community came together with us to give back in a meaningful way.”
